800 Attend 7th Annual Free Anaheim Health Fair


Braving a summer heat wave with daytime temperatures soaring into the range of 95 degrees, more than 800 patients attended the seventh annual free Anaheim Health Fair hosted June 30 by the City of Anaheim, Anekant Community Center, and GBS Linens, Inc., at Magnolia High School here.

Over 50 doctors and health care professionals donated their time at the free one-day event, assisted by more than 400 volunteers.

A partial list of the services offered included physical exams, heart checks, cholesterol, diabetes, and anemia tests, bone strength measurement, women's services, eye exams, chiropractic and acupuncture services, and voluntary bone marrow donor program sign-ups.
